Next month on Sept 17, IM2010 will be opened in Leiden, Holland: the 16th International Meeting of Collectors of Historical Calculating Instruments. Registered participants will receive their IM2010 Proceedings book at arrival in Leiden (there are still some seats available for late registrations!). The 208 pages of the Proceedings book contains 20 papers (see listing below) and descriptions of 17 rare "One-Off" specimens. The full-color print on special paper is of high quality, comparable to the renown Dutch IM2007 Proceedings of three years ago. Quality has its price, therefore we cannot afford to keep a stock of additional copies for back-orders by non-participants.

80 euro, shipped to "Rest Of World" by letterpost

Registered shipping will require an additional 5 euro.
